


Activity 1.1 Educational / Upskilling Support

This multimedia initiative successfully amplified the voices of queer individuals within educational discourse, providing a valuable resource for educators, allies, and institutions striving for inclusivity.

Activity 2.2: Sensitization Workshops in Academic Spaces

From April to December 2024, awareness workshops were conducted at academic institutions, **engaging 217 teachers**, **112 support staff**, **and 1,280 students**. The workshops focused on schools and colleges, aimed to educate youth about LGBTQ+ issues, promote inclusivity, and combat bullying in educational settings.

Topics including Sex Characteristics, Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity, and expression (SOGIESC), were covered with discussions on distinctions and proper usage and addressed the legal progress of LGBTQ+ rights in India.




Activity 3.1: Saksham – Job Fair



The **SAKSHAM Job Fair 2024**, hosted by The Humsafar Trust, aimed to boost inclusive employment for LGBTQ+ individuals in India, drawing over **18 employers and 180+ attendees from 500+ applicants.**

Highlights included:

- Panel Discussions: Moderated by Vivek Anand and Dhruv Goenka, with DEI leaders from P&G, Believe Music India, and Welspun discussing inclusive hiring and skills-based recruitment.
- Skill Development Recognition: Certificates were awarded to participants in a P&G Shiksha skill-building program.
- Film and Performances: Screening of "#UnheardStories Vijaya," showcasing resilience, and cultural performances by Color Positive Foundation artists, celebrated LGBTQ+ diversity.
- Employer Engagement: Employers like BMC Software and Godrej offered jobs and networking, with a 'Dolphin Tank' for community entrepreneurs.
- Closing Ceremony: COO Murugesan Sivasubramanian honored partners and employers, thanking participants.

The SAKSHAM Job Fair emphasized DEI's role in innovation, talent development, and aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals for Decent Work and Economic Growth..

Activity 3.2: Gulabi Mela 2025



Gulabi Mela 2025, the annual flagship event organized by Yaariyan, the youth initiative of The Humsafar Trust, was successfully held on 26th January 2025 in Mumbai. The event, supported by BMC Software India Pvt. Ltd., Blackrock Services India Pvt. Ltd., KPMG Global Services Pvt. Ltd., Sony Pictures Networks India Ltd., BDO Rise Private Ltd., and Dorf Ketal Chemicals India Ltd., witnessed an overwhelming turnout of over 1,300 attendees, celebrating queer entrepreneurship, creativity, and community spirit.





This year's edition of Gulabi Mela provided a dynamic platform for **52 LGBTQ+ entrepreneurs** to showcase and sell their products and services, which included handmade goods, accessories, clothing, stationery, food, and more. These entrepreneurs, including several supported by The Humsafar Trust's Dolphin Tank initiative, had the opportunity to connect with a larger community and gain visibility and support for their ventures.

The event came alive with more than 15 spectacular performances by queer artists and groups, ranging from music and dance to spoken word and live art. One of the most crowd-pleasing moments was an electrifying flash mob performance that captured the audience's attention and embodied the spirit of pride and inclusivity. Gulabi Mela also emphasized interactive engagement and wellness.

Attendees participated in free workshops, including a lively Bollyqueer dance session and an energetic Zumba workshop led by Lokesh Rane. These workshops encouraged movement, joy, and togetherness, contributing to the festive atmosphere.

The event reinforced the importance of safe, inclusive spaces that support queer youth, entrepreneurs, and artists, and showcased the continuing efforts of Yaariyan and The Humsafar Trust in building a future where diversity is not just accepted but celebrated.











Challenges Faced

Despite the project's impactful outreach, a few operational challenges emerged. Delayed responses from some scholarship recipients affected timely documentation and disbursement. The number of applicants QAFAB (Queer Assigned Female at Birth) individuals was lower than expected, indicating a potential need for wider outreach. Many students expressed that while financial support eased burdens, it wasn't always sufficient to cover them significantly. In our outreach to academic institutions for sensitization sessions, scheduling proved difficult as many prioritized core academics over inclusive education. Additionally, the podcast production faced delays due to the extended turnaround time by the production team; multiple rounds of feedback and follow-ups made it challenging to release the content within the originally planned timeline.

Conclusion & Impact

Project Avsar successfully continued its mission of bridging access to education, upskilling, and livelihood for LGBTQ+ communities. From supporting 118 students across 21 states with scholarships, to sensitizing over 1,600 academic professionals and students and curating impactful multimedia resources, our work echoed through classrooms, institutions, and digital spaces. The Saksham Job Fair further connected 547 LGBTQ+ individuals with inclusive employers, and Gulabi Mela celebrated 52 queer entrepreneurship, and 15 artists. The initiative fostered affirming spaces, built resilience, and strengthened socio-economic inclusion, reminding us that while the journey has its hurdles, the collective impact is transformative and far-reaching.
